EQ: How did the development of agriculture change daily life in the Neolithic Age from how it was in the Paleolithic Age?

In order to be successful on your upcoming assessment, you must complete items 1-5 below using flashcards or a separate sheet of binder paper.

1. Write a definition of all 9 vocabulary terms from the unit: nomad, Paleolithic Age, Neolithic Age, Fertile Crescent, Catal Hoyuk, domesticate, agriculture, trade, resource.
2. Write an explanation of the following concepts from the unit: hunter-gatherer, food supply, permanent settlement.
3. Make a T-chart to identify at least 3 main differences between the Paleolithic and Neolithic Ages.
4. Know where Neolithic settlements were located and why.
5. Identify and explain the 5 effects of the invention of agriculture, and know the order in which they occurred. (Fill out graphic organizer on back of this page.)
