Course Objectives:

The Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in mathematics serve as important benchmarks to ensure that all students are receiving high-quality education and are well prepared for success in postsecondary education and the workforce. The standards for middle school mathematics provide a coherent, rigorous, and rich curriculum in preparation for advancement to the next grade level.

The required text is California Go Math Middle School Grade 8

Supplementary material will be used in class based upon the learning needs of students.

Class Rules

Class Time:

Class time is very important and every moment spent on learning counts. It is expected that students will enter the classroom calmly at a voice level of 0 to 1 and sit in their assigned seat. It is of utmost importance that students arrive on time to class and ready to engage in academic instruction. We have 50 minutes a day in class and missed instruction leads to a lack of progress. Take care of any needs such as bathroom and water prior to the beginning of class. It is suggested that you have a water bottle, preferably a reusable container, so that water is accessible without leaving the classroom. The bell does not dismiss students, the teacher will dismiss students when they are seated in their assigned seats unless otherwise specified.

Grading Policy:

Students will have many opportunities to demonstrate achievement and progress through homework, classwork, notes, quizzes, tests, presentations, or group projects.

The class will adhere to the following grading policy:

- 90-100% A Outstanding
- 80-89% B Above Average
- 70-79% C Demonstrates Understanding
- 60-69% D Struggling
- 0-59% F In need of further intervention.

Homework:

Homework will be assigned on Monday-Thursday and will be explained the day it assigned. Homework is due at the beginning of the period the next day. Any classwork that is not completed during the period will become homework. It is expected that students will be engaged and on task during the class period. I will grade homework and return it to students in a timely manner such that they may fix any errors and turn it in for additional credit.

Students are responsible for making up any work missed due to an absence.

Late Work:

Late work will be accepted without penalty within a week of the due date. Later work will not be accepted after the cutoff date at the end of each grading period. These dates will be announced near the end of the grading period.
